
Lockdown Life is a collection of stories

Within a diverse variety, the very young compare the generosity of fairies on losing their teeth, the education system is shown to be fractured,



those at the sharp end tell how the NHS does its best to cope, businesses adapt to changes inside and outside the workplace, working from home, furlough and the anxiety that brings, and how the sick and elderly manage to survive, and for some it is the end.

Doctor, dentist, nurse, churches, hotels, factories, distillery, medical practices, airports, playing the pipes, organising pop-concert world-tours, public transport, the initial stampede by people of all nations to stockpile toilet rolls, and horses on furlough. Across the world a wave of anxiety accepts that lifestyle changes will emerge in the years ahead, most are prepared to meet this challenge, but the elderly defer the thought and reflect on the freedom and stability of life before Covid19.
